Emergency contraception

- It's a method of contraception used an emergency procedure before menstruation is missed to prevent pregnancy following unprotected intercourse or expected failure of contraception.
- EC is any method of contraception used after intercourse and before potential time of implantation.
- Alternative names postcoital contraception , morning after contraception , interception.



Characters :

- Its an one time procedure not a routine approach to contraception.
- Used postcoital.
- Its objective is prevention of pregnancy.



Historical background

- Abu Bakr Muhammad al Razi first immediately after ejaculation let arise roughly, squeeze and blow her nose seven times and call out in a loud voice, she should jump violently backwards 7-9 times.
- Traditional methods have been used for decades as high doses vit.C, aspirin or chloroquine.
- Vaginal douches of coca cola, baking soda.
- Mid 1920s effect estrogenic ovarian extract to prevent pregnancy.



- 1967 the first widely used methods were 5 days of treatment with DES in USA as a high dose estrogen.
- 1970 YUZPE method was developed as preparation contain estradiol/LNG.
- ▶ 1975 PROGESTIN only postcoital pill was investigated.
- 1975 copper IUCD was used as first time as EC.
- 1980s Danazol was tested as EC.
- 1980s YUZPE became as a standard EC.



- 1998 after a large WHO study YUZPE regimen was gradually withdrawn and LNG widely used.
- > 2002 China was the first country used mifepristone as EC.



Indications:

Unplanned sexual intercourse (sexual assault - return of husband).

Contraceptive accident (break of condom).



Advantages:

Save the couples from unwanted pregnancies.

From unnecessary operative interventions for fear of pregnancy.

- From agony waiting for next cycle.
- Prevent adolescent pregnancy.

Reduce unsafe abortions.



Mechanism of action:

- Interfere with ovulation only when given early delay LH surge
- Interfere with fertilization of ovum as regard sperm ascent and tubal motility / cx mucous.
- Interfere with implantation the main mechanism of action as regard renders endometrium not suitable for implantation
- Induction of early abortion the least one probable



Types:

Hormonal (emergency contraceptive pill)

Estrogen pills : EE 5mg 1×1×5 within 72 hour

Combined pills : so called Yuzpe regimen (0.25 mg LNG + 50 mic. EE)

Two doses within 72 hour of unprotected intercourse and repeated after 12 hour

(0.15 mg LNG + 30 mic. EE)

Four doses within 72 hour of unprotected intercourse and repeated after 12 hour

Pops : LNG 0.75 mg within 72 hour and repeated after 12 hour



► IUD :

up to 5:6 days of unprotected intercourse.

► RU 486 - Mifepristone :

Single dose 600 mg orally within 72 hour of unprotected intercourse.

Danazol :

400 mg tablet one tablet within 72 hour and other tablet after that by 12 hour.



Contraindications:

hormonal:

- History of severe CVS complications.
- Thromboembolic complications.
- Migraine.
- Liver disease.
- Angina pectoris.



IUCD:

- Pelvic infection
- DUB
- Nulliparous
- Uterine anomaly
- Allergy to copper



Side effects:

hormonal

- ▶ Nausea in 50 % in YUZPE regimen and in 20% in LNG.
- ▶ Vomiting in 20 , 5 %.
- Irregular uterine bleeding.
- Headache, dizziness, fatigue and breast tenderness.



IUCD

- Bleeding
- Pain
- Expulsion
- Pelvic infection.
